- ✓ **A paper bag** is the best option for packaging biowaste in terms of the treatment process at the biogas and composting plant!
Biowaste can also be collected in a fully compostable biowaste bag (cornstarch bag) or a paper wrap made from newspaper. Never pack biowaste in a plastic bag!
- ✓ **Absorb** running fats, oils, liquids, and broths with soft paper, egg carton shreds, or newspaper. Never pour fats down the drain—they will clog it! All household papers, tissues, and napkins sorted into biowaste work well as dry materials in the mix.
- ✓ **Keep biowaste as dry as possible.** Try to store biowaste as airy as possible in the kitchen. Drier biomaterial smells less and attracts fewer flies, for example.
- ✓ **Close the biowaste bag carefully** when you take it to the property's waste bin. A closed bag reduces the attractiveness and odors of biowaste in the environment.
- ✓ **Pack smelly waste**, such as fish or meat, separately, for example, in a newspaper wrap.
